### Social Records Presents.....

Coming on the heels of the recently released Kick It, Mirror Mirror currently is in the "Social" Records studio beginning the still untitled fourth album.



"The fourth album is coming along," Tracy Allen, lead singer of the band said. "We've already recorded the first single Pulse and another song titled In A Heartbeat."

The first single Pulse debuted in the Mid Ohio Valley on February 2 at Riverside 181 in Marietta. The band also showcased the song during the February 16 Winger concert at the Alrosa Villa in Columbus in which the band was an opening act.

Although the recording process has begun, the album is still not complete.

"We're still in the writing process, but we have a lot of songs already done. They just don't have titles yet," Tracy said. "But we're hoping to have a fall release date for the new CD."

The band also has been busy gaining some national attention as Fun4AllRadio.com broadcast the March 10 gig live on the Internet from Six Pence Pub and Eatery in Parkersburg. Fun4AllRadio.com, located out of south central Pennsylvania, had seven disc jockeys, one driving from Georgia and another driving from Michigan, on hand for the special event.



A Mid-Ohio Valley favorite, N/V, began the evening by getting the crowd ready to party. N/V, led by frontman Jamie Fletcher, gave one heck of a performance. If you've never seen N/V perform, make sure that you check them
